Mobile Computing Device Loan Specifications

Terms

The student must comply at all times with the MNPS Student Technology Acceptable Use Policy, incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof for all purposes. Any failure to comply will terminate a student's rights of possession effective immediately and the District may repossess the property.

Title

Legal title to the property is in the District and shall at all times remain in the District. A student's right of possession and use is limited to and conditioned upon full and complete compliance with the Agreement and the Parent/Student Laptop Handbook

Loss or Damage

If the property is damaged, lost or stolen, the student is responsible for the reasonable cost of repair or its fair market value on the date of loss. Loss or theft of the property must be reported to the District by the next school day after the occurrence. A table of estimated pricing for a variety of repairs is included in the Parent/Student Laptop handbook to which reference is hereby made.

Repossession

If a student does not timely and fully comply with all terms of this Agreement and the Parent/Student Laptop Handbook, including the timely return of the property, the District shall be entitled to declare that student in default. The District is also entitled to use reasonable means to take possession of the property.

Term of Agreement

A student's right to use and possession of the property terminates not later than the last day of the school year unless earlier terminated by the District, upon withdrawal from the District, or at the sole discretion of the district. Mobile computing devices must always be available for school or district inspection.

Review Annually Failure to timely return the property, and/or any use of the device for non-school purposes without the District's consent will be considered unacceptable use of the District's property.

Use of Computers and Laptops on the Network

Students may not loan laptops or other equipment to other students; borrow a laptop from another student; or share passwords or usernames with others.

There are many sites on the Internet that can be potentially dangerous to minors. These sites are blocked while students are logged on to the District network, but may be unprotected at home. Students are in violation of district policy if they access these sites through proxies. Parents may want to restrict their home access. Students may not delete any folders or files that they did not create or that they do not recognize. Deletion of certain files will result in a computer failure and will interfere with your ability to complete class work and may affect your grades.

Music and games may not be downloaded or streamed over the Internet without the express permission of a teacher or administrator. All copyright laws must be followed concerning the permission to download music and games. All software loaded on the system must be District approved.

Access to another person's account or computer without their consent or knowledge is considered hacking and is unacceptable and will be considered a violation of use.
